The 4¢ Grant issue of 1902 was made in an imperforated form in 1908 for the Schermack Mailing Machine Company for two of their customers, Hamilton Carhart Company and Winfield Printing Company.

A Detroit stamp collector, Karl Koslowski, lived near Schermack and someone living in the same house as he worked at the company, so Koslowski spent time at the plant.

On May 27, 1908 Koslowski was planning to leave for a trip to his home country of Latvia and stopped by the plant. There he saw a delivery of sheets of stamps waiting to be processed. In the shipment were 25 sheets of 400 imperforated stamps, 10000 stamps.

Not wanting to spend \$16.00 on a sheet of 400 that was offer to him, he left. The next morning before leaving on his trip he went back to buy whatever he could. He found that the sheets were all perforated with the Schermack Type III style and distributed to their two customers. He went to Winfield, which was closer, and was able to purchase 50 perforated stamps for \$2.00. He then left Detroit to go on his trip.

Months later on his return to tried to buy more but there were none to be found. The rest is history.

This imperforated stamp was a variation of the 1917-1919 Type I unwatermarked stamp used by the Mail-O-Meter Company for its private perforations process of Schermack Type III and Mail-O-Meter Type IV used on its affixing machines.

The variation came about because of the use of a new transfer roll in the Bureau's printing process around 1919. This new variety was not discovered for many years after it was produced.

That is one reason why there have been so few stamps and covers found. All those discovered have Schermack Type III perforations. No records exist as to how many of this stamp variety were purchased by Mail-O-Meter for their use.

The previously shown 1½¢ Harding imperforate stamp was produced on April 4, 1915 for use on third class circular mail because of a rate change from 1¢, effective April 15, 1925.

The Mail-O-Meter Company was at that time owned by Pitney Bowes Company, they still had customers using their Schermack Type III perforated coils in their affixing machines. Still using this value stamp in 1926, the company had to order additional quantities for its customers.

To handle this order for the imperforates the Bureau of Printing used their newer and faster process, the Rotary Press. This process was being used to produce coiled stamps already. Because this was a different process then had previously been used for the imperforates stamps, it produced different spacing between the stamps and gutter spacing between the panes. The Schermack automatic coil producing machines could not produce its standard perforations properly. It would require hand cutting and that was not satisfactory for them, so they returned the stamps to the government.

Assuming that only a few test sheets were processed unsuccessfully and may have been discarded is the reason why so few samples have been found.
