COMPOUND PERFORATION VARIETIES

In 1913, at the time the perforating pins were changed from 12 to 10, a small quantity of sheets perforated 12 in one direction were fed through the new gauge 10 perforator in the other direction, thus creating the compound perforation varieties. Very few examples are recorded. The used copies on and off cover prove that these were issued through post offices.

The Two-Cent Type Ia was created during the experimental use of a ten-subject transfer roll to create printing plates. The Type Ia, a hybrid form of Type I, was issued in very small quantities from plates 10208 and 10209. The fully perforated stamp (Scott 500) is extremely scarce; the imperforate Type Ia, which comes only with Schermack private perforations (Scott 482A), is a great rarity.
